Asya Litvak died peacefully at home on her 60th birthday, Saturday, January 9, 2016, following a courageous year-long battle with cancer. Her husband and daughter were at her side. In 1999, she opened her own school: West Suzuki and Traditional School of Music. Music was her grand passion throughout her life, and it helped her through the hardest of times. She was deeply loved over the years by her students and their families.

Asya was a kind and spiritual person. She devoted a great deal of time to

studying religion and spirituality. Every week for many years, she volunteered at a local church to help feed the homeless. She cared deeply about her friends and family.
