She is survived by her two sons Allan Gregory Alper and Brian Strong Alper, three sisters Marsha Bornstein, Susan Bledsoe, Anita Chambers, three

grandchildren, Sophie, William and Ian, and several nieces and nephews. The Funeral Service will be held at Emanu El Cemetery at 4pm on Sunday, January 31, 2016.
