Barbara Marcia Roth Haveson peacefully passed away on Thursday, October 31, 2024, after a courageous battle with cancer. Born August 4, 1934, in Wharton, Texas, Barbara enjoyed all the charm and familiarity of growing up in a tight-knit community surrounded by family and friends.

Barbara attended the University of Texas and stayed a devoted fan of her Texas Longhorns. While attending UT, she met her husband of fifty-four years, Robert, while he was stationed at Bergstrom Air Force Base. The pair married in 1956 and eventually moved to Houston where Barbara received her degree in Education from the University of Houston. Barbara began her teaching career in Houston and eventually moved to the Fort Bend School District where she stayed until her retirement in 1990 after almost thirty years of teaching.

While living in Houston, a cousin made her a lifetime Hadassah member on the condition that she would actively take part. and holding various leadership roles including president. Her dedication was recognized when she was named Woman of Valor in 2010.
