August 3, 1952 - January 27, 2015

Carole Lynn Levy passed away Tuesday, Jan 27, 2015. Carole lost the battle of a major illness she had bravely fought for the last few years. Carole was born in Detroit, MI on August 3, 1952 to Ralph and Rosaline Sparr. When she attended college she graduated with a B.F.A. from Stephens College in Columbia, MO, from the school of performing arts with a major in theater and education, and later obtained a Masters of Special Education from Oakland University, Rochester, MI. She spent her working years as a very well-loved special education teacher in Waterford Middle School, Waterford, MI. She was a dedicated teacher who worked with the students and parents of learning-challenged children. She was the manager, administrator, and head chaperone for the schools Senior Trip for 16 years, which took 200 - 300 students each year to Washington, DC. This involved fundraising, accounting, planning, and coordination, and performing as the trip leader. And she also worked part time as a landscape designer for a large, upscale landscape service, as she was very artistic. Upon moving to Texas she taught special education in the middle schools for a couple of years in the Lewisville ISD, and then retired to enjoy her life here with her husband, Bill. Carole and Bill enjoyed 20 happy years together, along with many friends that they both associated with. She enjoyed flower designing, reading, movies, a little TV, and most of all, travel. Carole was a Red Hat for a while, meeting many more new friends there. She was truly happy in her world and brought this to everyone she touched. Her nickname was Princess and she truly was one.

Carole is survived by her husband Bill, a Viet Nam Veteran, and her only sister Donna. She is interred in the Dallas-Ft. Worth National Cemetery where she awaits for the arrival of her husband, then both to be transferred to a final resting place in the Arlington National Cemetery.
