David Netzer, 78, passed away peacefully on Friday, February 21, 2020 in Houston, Texas. David was born on December 7, 1941 in Israel to the late Zacharia and Shoshana Netzer.

David graduated from the Technion University in Haifa, Israel in 1966, receiving his graduate degree in Chemical Engineering. He emigrated to the US in 1967, starting his life in Queens, NY later moving to Houston, Texas in 1973. Shortly after, he became a naturalized U.S. citizen, and firmly established himself in the community. David was very tenacious, a hard worker and very passionate about science and his chosen profession. He was well revered by his colleagues and went on to invent and patent his prized formulaic accomplishments. David was mostly a serious man with a penchant for chess, flying, talking history and engaging in political debates. He embodied a softer side too, always there for those in need, especially his family. David loved to joke and horse around; humor was always a big part of his life.
