



Eduard V. Pylnik

January 22, 1933 - December 20, 2020

Eduard V. Pylnik, 87, passed away peacefully at his home on Sunday, December 20, 2020 in Houston, Texas. He was born January 22, 1933 to Ekaterina Fadeevna Kalantarova and Victor Victorovich Pylnik in Baku, Azerbaijan. Eduard graduated high school in Baku and went on to earn his college diploma. After successfully earning a PhD in construction materials in Minsk, Eduard became a Chief of Laboratory in the Baku Scientific Institute of Technology Construction Materials, where he authored 142 scientific articles and received 31 patents.

Young Eduard had a difficult childhood. In 1939 his father Victor V. Pylnik was arrested and sent to Stalin's gulag labor camp where he survived until full acquittal and release in 1956. During these years Eduard and his younger sister Nona were raised by their mother Ekaterina F. Kalantarova, a strong and brave woman who was able to instill her best qualities into Eduard - optimism, honesty, love for his family and friends, honoring family values and traditions. Eduard's sisters, cousins, and family were deeply loved.

During his sophomore year in college, while working in a drawing room, Eduard met the love of his life, his wife Nina Mirzoyan. They shared the next 69 years of their happy lives together.

Eduard Pylnik is survived by his dear wife Nina, the only and beloved

daughter Elena and her husband Vladimir Sukholutsky, the only and deeply loved grandson Dennis Sukholutsky, his wife Victoria and their two children - Eduard's favorite great grandson Miles and his favorite great granddaughter Amelia.

Eduard always liked to be together with his many friends, most of whom he knew since they were students. Life spread them around the world and Eduard relocated to Houston in 1990 with his family. Eduard used every opportunity to travel and visit them in different countries and continents. He loved to gather friends together and drive them around Texas in a van. Eduard shared his good humor and joy, playing practical jokes to make his friends laugh and smile.

Eduard is forever in our memories and hearts.
