Frederick Stuart Tyser, 96, passed away in his sleep on Sunday, August 22, 2021 at Seven Acres Jewish Senior Care Services following a brief illness. Fred was preceded in death by his wife of 66 years, Evelyn Finkelstein Tyser, brother Norman Tyser, mother Sara Tyser, and father Sam Tyser. He was the head of B'nai Brith Bowling league, an avid Shriner, and volunteer driver transporting children to various hospitals in Houston and Galveston. He was a regular blood doner and worked many blood drives for the Shriners. Fred and Evelyn were life-long members of Congregation Emanu El in Houston.
