Howard Waldman was born in New York City and moved to Houston at age seven with his family, parents, Sol and Sally Gerwitz Waldman, and sister, Sharon Waldman (Witten).

A graduate of San Jacinto High School, Howard obtained his undergraduate degree in accounting and his law degree from University of Texas, Austin. After practicing law in Houston for several years, he joined his father at Waldman & Company, where he expanded the drapery business for over fifty years before retirement. He supported many philanthropic organizations including Aishel House, Jewish National Fund, B'nai B'rith men, United Orthodox Synagogues, Jewish Federation of Greater Houston and Israel Bonds.
