Judith “Judy” Grossman, aged 90, passed away peacefully on Friday, October 18, 2024, in Houston, Texas. Born on August 6, 1934, in Detroit, Michigan, to the late Gilbert and Adele Applebaum, Judy grew up in Detroit and graduated from Central High School in 1952. Shortly thereafter, she began her career in real estate before marrying Marvin Grossman in 1955.
