Mike graduated from Bellaire High School before attending The University of Texas and receiving a J.D. from South Texas College of Law. He also attended Oxford University. Mike's life was dedicated to the practice of criminal law, primarily as a chief felony prosecutor first in Harris County and spent over 20 years as a senior prosecutor at the Bexar County District Attorney's Office.
