M. M. Feld of Houston, Texas, passed away peacefully at age 91 on Tuesday, April 23, 2024. As was true in the rest of his life, he spent the last days of his journey with those he loved, who also loved and cared for him. Born and raised in Houston, M. M. lived his entire life in his hometown except for a stint in El Paso, TX where he was stationed while serving in the United States Army Reserve.
