



## Martin Belasco

June 15, 1950 - December 5, 2021

Martin Belasco, 71, passed away peacefully at home in Houston on Sunday, December 5, 2021, after a hard battle with cancer. Marty was born in Philadelphia to Norman and Bernice Belasco. His family moved to Houston in 1963 so his father could work at the newly opened Johnson Space Center. At Bellaire High School he met the love of his life, Fredell Kost, and they married in 1973. He graduated from Rice University and then received a master's degree in accounting from the University of Houston. He spent his professional career as a partner and trusted tax advisor at David Miller and Company, a boutique CPA firm in Houston, where his long-time clients revered him for his expertise, kindness, and patience. Marty was a fantastic historian and avid sports enthusiast, with an encyclopedic-like knowledge of both history and sports trivia. If he went missing, you could typically find him in his regular seat at a Rice baseball game. He believed wholeheartedly in enjoying a long summer vacation with his family, and in the twilight of his life, he found great pride and enjoyment being with his grandchildren. Marty is survived by his devoted wife, Fredell; his two children Michael (Abby) and Melanie (Elan); his beautiful grandchildren Jay, Breck, Owen, Asher, and Molly; and, his sister Phyllis (Sheldon). The hard work and dedication of his caregivers, Chris Vique and Carlos Colon, allowed him to spend his last few months resting comfortably at home. A private graveside service was held at Beth Yeshurun Allen Parkway Cemetery. A memorial service will be held on Wednesday, December 8, 2021, at 5:30 PM at Congregation Beth Yeshurun.
