Martin graduated from Brooklyn College of Pharmacy and served as an Army medic in post-World War II Germany. After returning from abroad, he decided shortly thereafter to move to Houston, Texas. In Houston, he founded Martin Surgical Supply Company where he worked until a few weeks before his passing.
