



Miles Wertheimer

October 8, 1959 - October 19, 2025

It is with deep sadness and heavy hearts that the family of Miles Nedler Wertheimer announces his passing on Sunday, October 19, 2025. He left us way too soon, only 11 days after his 66th birthday. Miles left this world doing what he enjoyed most, enjoying quality time with his beloved family - this time in New York City to visit his daughter Jackie's new hometown.

Miles was the youngest of four children born in Houston to Sharla and Henry Wertheimer, of blessed memory. Much of his childhood, beginning at the age of 2, was spent in Rosenberg, Texas, where his upbringing was rooted in service to others. His father, a pharmacist, owned and operated Schaefer's Pharmacy, while serving as a community leader, as Mayor of Rosenberg and an active member of the school board. His mother also lived an active life of service holding several volunteer positions such as Hadassah chapter president and a member of the Seven Acres Board.

Miles attended Lamar Consolidated High School in Rosenberg, then graduated from Tulane University with a degree in Mathematics and Stastics in 1982. Miles worked for Hewlett Packard as a systems analyst and program manager, beloved by his many coworkers for over 36 years.

The role Miles cherished most was husband to his wife of over 35 years, Mindy, and father to his two daughters, Holli and Jaclyn, who call him the very

definition of The Ultimate Girl Dad. His daughters cherish his unmatched unconditional love often expressed by doing everyday actions extraordinarily from airport pick up rides with Whataburger in tow, to sending them home with his famous care packages with a frozen smoked chicken for dinner and everything in between - no act was too big or too small, it was all an expression of his endless love.

Those who knew him best describe him as the most giving, loving, thoughtful person they ever knew. He loved nothing more than setting a table surrounded by people he loved. Most recently, his meals were not complete without his famous homemade ice cream.

He also loved to bowl, first at Palace Lanes, then Emerald Bowl in Stafford, where he played weekly in The Old Timers League. He was also a sports and movie buff.

Miles was THE definition of a mensch. He continued his family legacy of service and held many roles in the community. He held countless positions including the Seven Acres Board, the CYJ Texas Scholarship committee, the Beth Yeshurun Cemetery Committee, the Religious School Education committee, among others. He was a dedicated blood donor who donated gallons of his own blood to strangers regularly – he was one of the top donors in the state of Texas. Miles was a deeply religious and spiritual man, and lived out the Jewish values of Tikkun Olam.

Miles was a selfless individual and never saw his actions as anything special. He loved helping others and felt blessed he was given the skillset combined with a supportive family that allowed him to serve.

Miles is survived by his wife Mindy Ehrenkranz Wertheimer, daughter, Holli Wertheimer Abrahams, and son-in-law, Matt Abrahams, and daughter Jaclyn

Wertheimer, and partner, Cameron Soliz. The wider family includes Miles's siblings, Kim Wertheimer, partner, Kathy Dreyfus, Jane Solimani, and Stephen and Gabrielle Wertheimer, and Mindy's siblings and their spouses, Aimee and Don McCrory, Heather and Bob Westendarp, and Stan Ehrenkranz and Cindy Gabriel, along with many special nieces, nephews, and cousins who will always remember how he made them feel. He was predeceased by his loving parents Sharla and Henry Wertheimer.

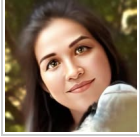

“ A Memory of Miles

I had the privilege of knowing Miles for more than two decades during my time at HP and later HPE. What began around the year 2000 grew into a relationship that became one of the greatest gifts of my 34-year career.

Miles was more than a colleague - he was a mentor, a guide, and a steady presence. When I was deep in analysis and needed clarity, I turned to him. He never hesitated to help, whether it was early morning in Jakarta while he was on his treadmill, or during his evenings when he was cooking dinner and sharing a little about his day. Across time zones and continents, he made distance feel irrelevant.

I remember once being on the phone with him when one of his daughters asked who he was speaking with. He answered, “Hannah.” I didn't see her smile but she said it was the same name as her best friend. It was a small moment, but it stayed with me, a glimpse of the warmth and family pride that surrounded him.

Later, when I transitioned to HPE, Miles continued to support me, pointing me to the right people, opening doors quietly, and making sure I was never left without guidance. Just as he carried so many others at HP, he carried me too, even though I was on the other side of the globe, in what must have seemed like an unseen country from his vantage point.

Those of us who worked closely with Miles know that behind serial numbers, systems, and technical details were stories, wisdom, and generosity. He shaped people by kindness, patience, and integrity.

I used to call him “Angel.” To me, he truly was one - walking beside me through many professional seasons. Though he now walks his own path into eternity, his guidance, legacy, and quiet strength remain with all of us who were fortunate enough to know him.

To Miles' beloved family, his wife, his daughters and all who loved him - please accept my deepest condolences. May you find comfort in knowing how profoundly he touched so many lives across the world.

Miles will be dearly missed and forever remembered with gratitude.

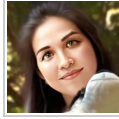
I'm sad because he didn't get to retire. But I think he knew the place would fall apart if he did. You think it's hyperbole. He was holding a major part of the company together.
