Robert "Bob" Altshuler passed away unexpectedly on Thursday, September 16, 2021 surrounded by those who cared for him most. He is survived by his wife of 51 years, Tammi Altshuler, their daughter, Lainie Maier, sister in law & brother in law Neidra & Michael Davis, niece Jillian Davis & numerous nieces, nephews & cousins. Bob was originally from New Jersey, but relocated to Miami Beach, Florida at a young age & referred to Miami Beach as his hometown. He graduated from Florida Atlantic University with a Business Administration degree, which he always displayed proudly in his home office. While attending FAU he began working at Wohl Shoe Company, and after graduating from college, the company relocated him to Houston, Texas where he was introduced to his wife of 51 years, Tammi, through mutual friends. Tammi & Bob were made for one another, & shared more laughter than tears throughout their 52 years together. Bob was a simple man, with simple tastes. He was an avid sports fan, & always wore his team regalia to "bring them luck" when watching games on TV. Bob had a shoe fetish & a very large ballcap collection. He always made sure that his ballcap color coordinated with his shirt. In recent times, he enjoyed binge watching action movies on Netflix & playing in the weekly game of Black Jack, which was dealt by his daughter, Lainie. 2020 was a challenging year, with COVID safety protocols restricting the almost

daily visits from either his wife or his daughter, but Bob took it in stride & learned to video chat. Bob made Seven Acres his home for the past 9 years, when his Parkinson's progressed to the point where he needed more managed, round the clock care. He was a fixture there, serving as President of the Resident's Club, where he proudly wore a ballcap that read "PRESIDENT" to the meetings, and was always available for a photo op.
