cared for after the passing of his father, Poy. His steadfast love and dedication to his family were hallmarks of his life.

Bob is survived by his sister, Susie Bender, and her husband, Scott; his sister, Lori Cohen, and her husband, Mike; and his brother, Jerry Levey, and his wife, Shelley.
