Ruth Rosenthal passed away on Sunday, April 30, at Seven Acres Jewish Senior Care in Houston.

Born July 25, 1920 Ruth was part of a large family of brothers and sisters. She was raised by her parents, Herschel and Hessie Miron. She attended high school at Jefferson Davis but her real education probably came in a living with four brothers and four sisters. After graduation from high school, Ruth went to work at Sakowitz for a few years then enrolled in the University of Houston Nursing program during World War II. She met Robert Rosenthal and they were married in 1947. They raised four children Marilyn, Marc, George, and Stanley. At time of her death she had five grandchildren Marco, Josh, Michelle, Celeste, and Elie; and three great grandchildren Dylan, Siboney, and Maya.

Ruth worked as a Medical Record Librarian for a number of years, studying diseases and anything that had to do with health. She was an active democrat, even aspiring to be a delegate at the national conventions. Ruth was one of the main contributors to the history of the Miron family and spent months researching documents and oral histories from family elders to complete a booklet describing the family tree.

Ruth and Bob enjoyed visits with children and grandchildren, nieces and nephews from all over the country. Robert died in 2008 and as her own health

began to fail, she became a resident of Seven Acres. She was diagnosed with aphasia, unfortunately losing the ability to express speech, although she understood much of what we said but couldn't reply.

Ruth was creative and idealistic with a very silly sense of humor. She left a legacy that carries through to this day with numerous puns and corny jokes, told by our great grandchildren.
