Sherry Ann DeWitt Hager, 79, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, October 13, 2021 in Houston, Texas. Sherry was born on December 30, 1941 in Streator, Illinois to the late Robert Dean DeWitt and Harriette Ann Chapman DeWitt. Her father was killed in World War II when she was just two years old. Sherry graduated from Springfield High School in 1959 and received her Bachelor of Arts from Milliken University in 1963. Sherry had a full career that included managing medical practices in Texas as well as Florida. Most recently she was Practice Manager at Texas Children's Hospital. Sherry was always very active in her community and spent a great deal of time dedicated to peace and social justice. She was an active member of Congregation Brith Shalom and greatly enjoyed participating in the Sisterhood study group.
