Sidney Aron, 86 passed away peacefully, surrounded by his children on Wednesday, September 16, 2015. Sidney was the third of five children born to Esidore and Orina Aron in Goose Creek, TX. Sidney graduated from San Jacinto High School in 1947. After graduating, he studied in Paris and briefly attended the University of Texas at Austin.
