Stuart H. Rosenthal passed away peacefully on October 29, 2018 in Houston, Texas. He was born on February 20, 1941 to loving parents, Esther and Myron Rosenthal, in Detroit, Michigan. His father died when Stuart was only twelve years old, catapulting him into the role of patriarch of the family.
