He is survived by his loving wife, Ieene; son James Wayne Morrison; daughters Marcia Richardson (David) and Sheri Glantz (Barry); grandchildren; and great grandchildren; and sisters Florine Stroud, Alvalene Foster, Merline Williams, and Frances Morrison.
